Reynolds Gallery is pleased to announce our third pop up exhibition in Boston, MA. Reynolds Gallery Boston will be open every day from 11am to 6pm beginning November 7th through the 19th, located at 220 Newbury Street. We will celebrate the temporary gallery with a public reception on Friday, November 10th from 6 – 9 pm.

Based in Richmond, Virginia, Reynolds Gallery has been exhibiting challenging contemporary art since 1977. The gallery was founded by Beverly Reynolds, who identified the need and opportunity for a contemporary art gallery in Richmond. Her first show included Alexander Calder gouaches and Max Ernst drawings. Over the next three decades, Reynolds Gallery grew into one of the most well-known Mid-Atlantic galleries, exhibiting blue-chip artists like Ellsworth Kelly, John Baldessari, Sally Mann, and Wolf Kahn. In addition, Reynolds Gallery represents regional artists from a rich pool of talent in Virginia, often professors and students from Virginia Commonwealth University. (VCUarts is ranked the number one public art school in the nation.) In 2014, Alice Livingston, Bev's daughter, and Julia Monroe, former assistant director, took over as co-directors of the gallery.

Continuing our founder's legacy of exhibiting the highest caliber artists and establishing lasting client relationships, we expand our mission into Boston. We partner with Bev's son and daughter-in-law Quentin and Sarah Reynolds of Wellesley, who hosted our first pop up in Massachusetts in 2014 as a private exhibition in their home. In November 2016, we held *Off The Cuff*, a week-long, public pop-up on Newbury Street, which we have reestablished this year in 220 Newbury Street as a two-week exhibition.

Our extended time in Boston is an opportunity not only to reconnect with the art community and enthusiasts, but also to bring a new perspective and fresh talent to the arts scene. We invite seasoned collectors, curious beginners, and passersby to engage in our distinguished, broad spectrum of work. This exhibition highlights our collection of emerging, mid-career, and internationally acclaimed artists. The show includes works by Andras Bality, Isabel Bigelow, Nell Blaine, Nancy Blum, Sally Bowring, Steven Cushner, Andrea Donnelly, David Freed, Ron Johnson, Wolf Kahn, Alex Katz, Sally Mann, Brittany Nelson, Eva Rocha, Dorothea Rockburne, Richard Roth, Joel Shapiro, Robert Stuart, Donald Sultan, Leigh Suggs, Javier Tapia, Heide Trepanier, Jack Wax, and others.

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
